The recipient is chosen by the Chair of the Michigan Democratic Party to honor an individual for his/her work to promote equality and inclusion of all people from every race, creed and gender in the Democratic Party. This year this honor was bestowed upon MIADC's very own Dr. Swarn Rajpal.

Swarn Rajpal's name will be engraved on the Martin Luther King Jr. Freedom Award Plaque that is displayed at the Hart Kennedy House.

Dr. Swarn Rajpal is General Surgeon, Senior staff physician, Henry Ford Health System, Sterling Heights, MI. Most recently was chosen to cast vote in the historic electoral college ceremony at the state capitol officially electing Sen. Barack Obama as President of the United States. ## *MIADC Hits the Ground Running in 2009*

The year started with a **General Body Meeting on Jan 11** for electing a new board. The meeting was attended by invited guests, Mark McGuiness (Chair, OCDP), Mark Brewer (Chair, MDP), State Senator Hansen Clarke and State Rep. Rashida Talib. All the invited guests recognized the contributions made by the Indo-American community in the general election campaign of 2008, providing resources and votes to elect democrats at all levels.

The election of the new board was followed by a gathering of the membership at the **State Democratic Party Convention on Feb 21** at the Cobo Hall. As is the custom at the convention, many elected officials and party members visited the caucus meeting and addressed the attendees. Guests included Lt. Governor John Cherry (candidate for governor), Mark Brewer, Rashida Talib, State Senator Deb Cherry, State Rep Lee Gonzales, State Rep Dian Slavin, Wayne County Circuit Judge Mark Slavin and Sandy Burgess (past-chair of Troy Democratic Club). A good part of the meeting was in an "open mike" forum, allowing members and other attendees to engage in a dialogue on a whole range of issues facing the Indian community, the state and the country.

The new board met for a **Strategic Planning Retreat on March 22** in Grand Blanc and spent a full day working through goals, priorities and planning for 2009-10. The board leveraged the lessons learned of the past few years and the diversity from several new faces in the new board to develop a common understanding of what MIADC does well, what needs to change and what new areas to explore. The result of the meeting was to create a blueprint for action for the next two years.

MIADC Membership Chair Ratna Rao along with member Megan Rao, conducted a **Community Outreach to Detroit Telugu Association on April 4** during the DTA celebration of Ugadi in Commerce Township. Ratna reached out to many attendees, distributed MIADC flyers and several people filled out a survey. Such reaching out to a major Indian cultural association, in an organized way, was a first for MIADC.

**A Membership Meeting on April 19** took place at the residence of members Dr. Guruswamy and Jayanthi Balakrishnan in Bloomfield Hills. Many of the attendees were new to MIADC and were favorably impressed in getting to know the caucus. Judy Karandjeff, Executive Director of the Michigan Women's Commission was the main speaker at the meeting. Judy spoke on many issues including health care and laws protecting women. Special guests in attendance were Barbara McCallahan, representative from US Senator Debbie Stabenow's regional office for southeast Michigan, Jocelyn Benson, candidate for Secretary of State, Sook Wilkinson, Chair of ACA-PAA (Governor's Advisory Council on Asian Pacific American Affairs) and Chair of the newly created Asian Pacific American Commission and Natalie Mosher, candidate for 14<sup>th</sup> congressional district. A heartfelt thanks to the Balakrishnan's for opening up their home and to events chair Rita Ravikrishnan for helping organize the event.

Along with Indo-Americans, the event was attended by Arab American, Black, and Hispanic caucus representatives. Elected representatives in attendance were State Rep. Lee Gonzales, State Rep. Richard Hammil, and State Senator Deb Cherry. Other special guests in attendance were Jack Minore, Chair of Genesee County Democratic Party, Gerri Hall, Chair of Black Caucus and Vice-chair of Genesee County Democratic Party, Sally Shaheen Joseph, Trustee of Mott Community college. Many in attendance narrated their personal anecdotes on racial profiling and slow processing of immigration applications. The meeting afforded an opportunity for the elected representatives and others to directly hear about issues facing Indo-Americans.

### ***MIADC Voices Support for Legislation and Denounces Insulting Comments to Indians***

The caucus has stood behind to support the legislation SB 0159, the anti bullying legislation in schools sponsored by Michigan State Senator Glenn Anderson will protect kids from being bullied in schools.
